## **PURPOSE**

- 1. To outline the use of a public participation program when considering amendments to the Municipal Planning Strategy and Land Use By-Law and any subsequent amendments thereto to regulate the development of wind turbines.
- 2. The Council shall not require the Planning Advisory Committee to conduct a public participation program for an amendment of the Land Use By-Law, if
  - (a) The amendment to the Land Use By-Law is undertaken in accordance with the planning strategy; or
  - (b) The amendment does not require a concurrent amendment to the Municipal Planning Strategy;
- 3. The Planning Advisory Committee shall conduct the Public Participation Program but the presentation of information and the receiving of comments shall be the responsibility of planning staff.
- 4. As the Municipal Planning Strategy and Land Use By-Law will apply to substantial portion, if not all, of the Municipality at least one public information session shall be held in a number of communities as selected by the Planning Advisory Committee.
- 5. The Planning Advisory Committee may deem additional sessions necessary.

- 6. Notification of the meeting and request for public input shall be circulated in the local paper within a 30-day period of the meeting. In addition, notices shall be posted in local businesses.
- 7. Other means of advertising may be approved by the Planning Advisory Committee.

## **UPDATE - MUNICIPAL ALCOHOL PROJECT**

Clr. Wadden reported that two of our three high school sessions have been held with the final one scheduled for this Thursday Nov. 6<sup>th</sup>. Overall we have captured about 90 students (30 per school) and as expected the young adults have so far presented very interesting perspective on their views on this whole issue so I look forward to seeing the final analysis of these discussions. At our monthly meeting we just had for MAP the majority of this meeting focused on our event we are planning for early December. Currently we are looking at early December possibly the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> or 9<sup>th</sup>. With the holiday season fast approaching the earlier in December the better. We feel a breakfast meeting would likely work best so are looking at possible 830 to 1130 or 9 to 12 noon. Jamie Smith will be leading the session and we are using the Chaordic Stepping Stones for Designing Meetings and Gatherings. We are working on the invitation list and all Councillors will be invited so I hope we do have a good turnout from our own council. I heard from Sophie today and there is a possibility of booking either Glasgow Square or The Wellness Centre. Would Councillors have a preference for where this event could be held? Personally, either venue is fine but I would prefer the Wellness Centre? Again this project is endorsed by our UNSM based on the information they have received from all Councils concerning developing and implementing a Municipal Alcohol Policy.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Nov 20 where we will finalize our event so will be advising Council of the date and time as soon as possible after that.

It was the consensus of Council members that the December event be held at the Pictou County Wellness Centre.

# **PULP MILL & NOVA SCOTIA ENVIRONMENT**

CIr. Turple addressed Council with regard to the emissions from Northern Pulp, stating that "the Pictou area is still getting more than 175 particulates from pulp mill. That mill is now 2 years late in meeting a condition and operating permit from the province when it was ordered to do an air quality study and install air quality monitors to measure the particulates. That was Nov 2012 and deadline extended by Province at least more than once. The Province is continually falling all over itself and allowing this mill to continually run with levels exceeding all health regulations. Oddly enough this has happened with all three political parties over the past 47 years. The pulp mill has changed hands many times over those years and it is my opinion the owners are doing this because they now know that they can. I personally have questioned this air quality with Dept. of Environment three or more years ago and was told that the mill measures its own air quality. Now nothing was mentioned about high level of particulates until Pictou Clean Air got involved. The Dept. of Environment appears powerless in enforcing any regulations against large companies like the Abercrombie Pulp Mill. However let you or I have an oil tank leak or spill and see how much that will cost

us. Let's see how much of a fine that will be given you or I by Dept. of Environment if we were to obstruct a waterway in any way, shape or form. I have a friend who within the past couple of years dug a pond on his own property so that his grandkids would have a place to skate during winter. The Department of Environment stepped in after it was dug and informed him that he was violating regulations concerning wet lands and it ended up costing him over \$10,000. But then again we have Boat Harbour, what a joke. How many of you know that the end results from Boat Harbour is released into the Northumberland Straight. Have samples ever been taken from our lobster, crab, mussels, oysters, etc. in that area to see what contaminates we are injecting into ourselves when eating these fish? Where is the Department of Health on all of this? It has been documented by different doctors over the past 47 years that health issues have and are occurring because of the pulp mill. But who is listening? We are informed that the new precipitator will probably resolve most when installed next March. But what about now? What about the past 47 years when said mill has been allowed to exceed all health regulations? What about the high cancer rates in and around Pictou County? Is it possible that just perhaps these particulates coming from those stacks may have any influence on cancer rates? On a personal note my father who was a fisherman and breathed the fresh salty air all his life was my age now when he first contacted cancer which later killed him. My mother is a cancer survivor as is my brother and I.

Our Environmental standards are far weaken then those of our neighbour to the south. The recovery boiler which is where the preceptor is to be installed removes particulates. I have been informed that Canadian regulations have set 175 milligrams per reference cubic meter. 175 are what is considered to be the maximum allowable level for particulates to be released into the air by industry here in Canada. The last round of testing after the shutdown from the mill indicated 49% over on three different tests. Before that they were 78% over. The stack limit is 175 and considered healthy for us here in Nova Scotia, Canada. In the USA it is not 175 mil per cubic meter but rather 35 mil per cubic meter. Particulates are the deadliest form of air pollution due to their ability to penetrate deep into the lungs and blood stream unfiltered causing permanent DNA mutations, heart attacks and premature death. The Cancer Agency of the World Health Organization announced that particulate matter is the leading cause of cancer. In fact they classified particulate matter in Group 1 along with tobacco smoke, asbestos, plutonium, silica dust and ultraviolet radiation. Particulates are now classified among the most dangerous carcinogens known to man. I, as recently as a few weeks ago, questioned this with people from the pulp mill and was told that yes we plan on meeting 175 milligrams per cubic meter when the new precipitator is installed which is the maximum level that Environment Canada allows. A friend of mine, Pam MacDonald, lives in Sylvester and there are days when one practically has to navigate on her property with a compass because of the mill's smog let alone the smell. On a clear day her gas stove gives off a bright blue flame however when the Pulp Mill smoke surrounds and invades her home on warm sunny days, the flame turns to orange so just what is in that smoke that causes a blue gas flame to turn orange? Miss MacDonald's life has turned upside down because of the smoke coming from the Pulp Mill. Now I am all for industry that will not knowingly pollute our air, land and water. I attended the session put on by the mill at the deCoste Center on October 23rd and found the presentations very interesting. It appears that the present owners may be truthful in cleaning up this mess. It must be noted however that when the new precipitator is installed and working, smoke will continue to pour from those stacks. The new precipitator will supposedly remove the particulates only but not eliminate the smoke simply because of the wet scrubbers that are installed thus creating steam. I personally see this as being a huge problem. Our residents here in Pictou County have put up with this for so long that when they see the continual pillars of smoke coming from those stacks, they will not believe that anything has been corrected. I actually believe that if Pictou County Clean Air did not become vocal; this precipitator might never have been slated for replacement. Yes we need industry and employment here in Pictou County with good paying jobs but at what costs? I believe that few people in Pictou County want the mill to shut down. We need industries and jobs here in Pictou County. However when in violations of environmental and health regulations, it is only fair that penalties be levelled upon them until the problem is corrected just like the rest of us taxpayers would encounter."

### **MOTION**

It was moved by Clr. Turple and seconded by Clr. MacMaster that the Municipality of Pictou County have its name added in support of clean air for everyone Pictou County.

Clr. D. Parker pointed out that the process of addressing emissions at the mill is well underway and he did not believe that we should rush to judgement when mill operators are trying to fix the problem. He recommended that Council wait to see what happens once the new precipitator is installed.

### **CLOSED SESSION**

Council met in closed session at 7:35 p.m. to receive legal advice eligible for solicitor-client privilege.

## **OPEN SESSION**

Council resumed in open session at 7:45 p.m.

## **WITHDRAWN**

On the agreement of the mover and seconder the motion was withdrawn.

## **UNION CENTER - INTERSECTION**

Clr. D. Parker informed Council that there was a meeting in Union Center approximately 2 weeks ago and the purpose of the meeting was to look at possible configurations for the intersections near the Esso Station and convenience store in Union Centre. The reason we are looking at them at this time is because next summer the bridge immediately adjacent to the Esso Service Station is going to be replaced. On the east side of the Middle River there is an intersection that does not work for modern traffic. There are 3 intersections where 1 goes up to the gas station yard that is a dirt road.

#### **MOTION**

It was moved by Clr. D. Parker and seconded by Clr. L. Fraser that a letter be sent to the Minister of Transportation & Infrastructure Renewal, with copies sent to the MLA for Pictou West, the Area Manager for Transportation & Infrastructure Renewal, and Paul Coulson, TIR Engineer in Truro, requesting that serious consideration be given to the realignment of those intersections in Union Center as part of the bridge replacement project in 2015.

Motion carried.

### RESOLUTIONS - PICTOU-NORTH COLCHESTER FEDERATION OF AGRICULTURE

Clr. Dewar presented 2 resolutions that were passed unanimously at the Pictou-North Colchester Federation of Agriculture annual meeting as follows:

Whereas local, small meat processors (or small local butcher shops) have been an integral part of our farming communities for many generations,

Whereas local small meat processors reduce the carbon footprint and provide an ethical, humane processing service,

Whereas local small meat processors are inspected on every visit by their customers who in turn are confident of receiving their own product that they delivered,

Whereas the Ivany Report recommends the encouragement and public support of small entrepreneurs in our communities,

Be it resolved that the Nova Scotia Federation of Agriculture, in conjunction with small local meat processors, act as a mediator to ensure a fair resolution that

allows them to remain viable by introducing a "tiered meat licensing system" that will ensure health and safety to all consumers.

Whereas the Natural Products Marketing Act, over 60 years old, does not adequately reflect the needs of today's progressive society,

Whereas the Nova Scotia Department of Agriculture is making a strong effort to encourage new entrants in the agriculture sector,

Whereas the current structure and legal authority of the Natural Products Marketing Council is too restrictive to allow for growth of new producers,

Whereas there is a growing desire, at the grassroots level, to grow and/or acquire local food, as is encouraged by the Ivany Report,

Whereas there is the potential for conflict-of-interest and/or abuse of power with the current Act,

Be it resolved that the Nova Scotia Federation of Agriculture lead the process for a complete revision of the Natural Products Marketing Act.

## **MOTION**

It was moved by Clr. Dewar and seconded by Clr. D. Parker that a letter be sent to the Nova Scotia Agriculture Federation to support the Pictou North Colchester Federation of Agriculture and the 2 resolutions passed at its annual meeting.

Motion carried.

Warden Baillie reminded Council there will be a joint meeting with the Town of New Glasgow on November 12<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. in the Town's Council Chambers to receive a presentation from the Age Friendly Communities Committee.
