Select "Pictou County Water"
Add all 8 digits of your Municipal Account number

Time travel

Mary and Allan Fraser gave a tour of A Walk Through Time Museum on Aug. 7 to councillors from the Municipality of Pictou County and their spouses.

The 10,000-square-foot museum showcases more than 7,000 artifacts from rural Pictou County and beyond. Together, they tell the story of work and life in Pictou County dating back decades.

The museum is located at 4119 Scotsburn Road, Hwy 256 Scotsburn, the former site of the Scotsburn Dairy, and is open to visitors from June through September.

The Museum is open daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. with the exception of holidays. Admission is \$10/person or 25/family.









PROVINCEWIDE Burn Ban in Effect

Because of hot, dry conditions, there is a ban on open fires effective immediately across the entire province.

The ban was put in place July 30, and will remain in place until October 15 – the end of wildfire season – or until conditions improve.

The fine for violating the ban is \$25,000.

"We've had a lot of hot, dry weather, very little rain and there's no significant rain in the forecast in the near future," said Tory Rushton, Minister of Natural Resources.

"We've had a lot of small, manageable fires this month and conditions are now ripe for any small fire to grow larger. Nobody wants a repeat of the devastation we experienced in 2023. I ask all Nova Scotians to co-operate, respect the burn ban and save their campfires and other open fires for a safer time."

The ban applies to open fires such as campfires, bonfires, brush fires, fires in chimeneas and any other fire that is not enclosed and uses wood as the fuel.

Unlike gas or charcoal fires, sparks could escape from an open wood fire and cause a wildfire.

Non-woodburning devices like charcoal and gas barbeques and gas stoves are allowed to be used, following manufacturer's instructions.


Family Fun Day!






River John celebrates milestones
