CEBA LOANS

Warden Parker said that during Covid, small businesses were not eligible for CERB. Many small businesses had no income during that time and the Federal Government extended the Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) loan. This loan offered small businesses interest-free loans up to \$60,000, and for eligible loan holders, could result in loan forgiveness of up to \$20,000.

When the time came to pay back the loan, many businesses could not pay this back. The repayment of this loan was extended to January 18, 2024. Warden Parker said the ask now is that the extension be applied to the \$20,000 grant as well as the pay back time. Warden Parker said that the CERB program was very fair and did not have to be repaid and small businesses are asking for the grant part to stay available.

It was moved by Warden Parker and seconded by Clr. Boyles that Council send a letter to Prime Minister Trudeau and MP Sean Fraser requesting the CEBA loans and grants for small businesses be extended until December 31, 2024.
