NOVA SCOTIA POWER OUTAGES

Clr. Butler said that over the past month, District 1 has experienced outages 5 different times, which is becoming increasingly frustrating to residents. Clr. Butler said that NSP officials went to lengths to explain the measures put in place, but in view of the number of recent outages and the number of calls received, wondered if there is anything else that can be done to apply pressure for improvement. Clr. Butler asked if other Councillors in the county are hearing similar concerns.

Clr. Parker said there is no doubt of frustrations and that the winds and power outages are more frequent and longer lasting. Clr. Parker said that the MOPC Fibre internet lines are on the same poles, and in working with Nova Scotia Power, there has to be work done to find solutions. NSP spends 2.5 to 3 times more on vegetation management than New Brunswick.

Warden Parker said there was a recent meeting with residents and top NSP officials. Nova Scotia Power has people out clearing trees and has talked about a willingness to set up community meetings; they want to work with the public and be able to cut the trees back further but are unable to without the permission of the property owner.

It was moved by Clr. Elliott and seconded by Clr. MacKeil to contact Nova Scotia Power officials and request a discussion with Council to set up community meetings.

Clr. Dewar requested sending a letter to the Nova Scotia Power officials who attended the recent meeting with the Warden to thank them for what they are doing and hoping for improvement.

REALLOCATION OF MUNICIPAL SERVICE GRANT MONEY

It was moved by Clr. Wadden and seconded by Clr. Elliott to approve Bethel Presbyterian Church to reallocate the funds from the Municipal Service Grant to make repairs to the church's exterior.
