On behalf of our Council, I want to wish all residents of our rural County, an enjoyable, restful, healthy and safe summer. Please look out for each other and keep our County clean.



## Paving the way

Work is progressing steadily on new sidewalks in Blue Acres. The new sidewalks were approved by Council for the Municipality of **Pictou County during their March 3** Council meeting. The contract was awarded to B.D. Clifton for \$863.500.00. Warden Robert Parker said they are grateful to have support for the project. The **Province of Nova Scotia** contributed \$515.801.00 from its **Growth and Renewal for Infrastructure Development** Program. When finished, the sidewalks will connect the stretch of land between New Glasgow and Stellarton, giving residents of the county and those towns a safe route to travel year-round.

Kennedy, along with other nominees and community groups, was honoured during a Volunteer Appreciation Event at the Pictou County Wellness Centre on April 29.



## Stay informed with MOPC Alert

In 2024 The Municipality of Pictou County added a new tool to communicate with residents, MOPC Alert.

MOPC Alert is used to send our residents alerts about upcoming severe weather, comfort center locations and operating times. MOPC Alert is also used to inform Municipal water customers when there are boil water advisories or other water-related issues that may be relevant. You can also sign up for notifications bout MOPC hosted public meetings or for our e-newsletter.

MOPC Alert will only be used to provide precautionary information. It will NOT be used to convey information that would otherwise be sent through the Nova Scotia Public Alerting System (Alert Ready).

Residents can choose what they want to be notified about and how they would like to be notified.

With the longer days, blooming gardens, and rising temperatures, summer is making its entrance! It's a wonderful time to get outdoors and enjoy everything our beautiful community has to offer. Whether you're hitting the trails, tending your garden, or spending time at the beach I hope you make the most of the season safely.

With the warmer weather and the summer months ahead, the ticks are active and here to stay. The impacts of tick-borne diseases can be debilitating and life changing. The number of ticks is steadily increasing in our area, and they are anywhere where you have trees, long grass and vegetation. This is why doing tick checks when you come inside is very important. And remember to check your pets as well. Education is the key. There has been a noticeable increase in coyote activity and sighting throughout District 9. Coyotes typically give birth to their pups between April and May. Please take caution, stay alert especially when walking pets or letting them out in your yard. Secure garbage and avoid feeding wildlife. If you encounter a coyote, do not run; stay calm, instead, make noise and back away slowly. To report a nuisance coyote phone 1-800-565-2224.

I have received numerous community complaints regarding speeding vehicles in our area. This is especially concerning in areas where children are at play. I urge all drivers to please slow down, and respect posted speed limits. The RCMP are aware of the situation and are actively working on addressing the issue. Please continue to drive safely and report any dangerous driving behavior to the authorities. Let's keep our neighborhoods safe.

Regarding roads and infrastructure for District 9.

A formal request for a meeting with our Pictou East MLA, Tim Houston has been submitted. While I received a written response outlining road improvement plans, I am still waiting on a confirmed date and time to discuss these issues further in person. I will keep residents informed on updates or when a meeting time becomes available. Since most roads in our rural areas are under provincial control, meeting with our MLA is necessary to address our road problems and how we fix them.





# **BurnSafe 101**

The BurnSafe map is your guide to when it's safe to burn in Nova Scotia during wildfire season, March 15 to October 15.



Burning is never allowed from 8 am to 2 pm during wildfire season because that is often when the risk of wildfires is greatest. The map is RED during those hours. After 2 pm, check for an update.

Burn restrictions are updated daily at 2 pm based on weather data.



Check online at NovaScotia.ca/BurnSafe or call 1-855-564-2876 to see if burning is allowed.

You could be fined \$25,000 if you do not follow Provincial restrictions
