<u>UP-DATE – RIVERVIEW ADULD RESIDENTIAL CENTER</u>

Clr. D. Parker reported that on June 10th he met with the CEO of the Residential Center who tendered his resignation for personal reasons and to pursue his own consulting business. The Board retained professional recruiting services and immediately started the process updating the job description and qualifications. A candidate was identified by the recruiting firm who was subsequently interviewed on June 24th and found to be suitable.
