Tax Payment Information

Property tax bills for the Municipality of Pictou County have been issued and the deadline for payment has been extended to July 22, 2020. Payments can be accepted in person at our Administration Building at 46 Municipal Drive, Pictou, but please respect the physical distancing rules in place because of COVID-19. We will accept cash, debit, or cheque in person. Cheques only can be mailed to, The Municipality of Pictou County, P.O. Box 910, Pictou, NS. BOK 1HO.

To reduce the traffic in our building, we encourage everyone to pay their taxes through online banking or by cheque in the mail. Cash is not accepted in the mail. There is also a mail drop off box in front of our administration building that can used for payments.

COVID-19 Property Tax Financing Program Policy

The Municipality is developing a residential and commercial tax financing plan to help residents and businesses during the pandemic. The overall criteria for an eligibility request is the demonstration of hardship. Program details will be released soon. The Municipality appreciates that many of our residents and industries are significantly impacted by COVID-19.

To participate in the program:

Applications will be required by July 15, 2020. An online application tool is being developed and will be accessible through the Municipality's website (www.county.pictou.ns.ca).

Taxpayers will pay \$25 per month for the first six months and then arrange to pay the remainder of the tax bill up to 24 months.

The Municipality will offer any qualifying participant an interest rate of 1.35% which is specific to this program alone.

To remain in the program, the tax payments must be kept current. A default will result in removal from the program and taxes will then be subject to the normal interest rate of 12 percent.

All public meetings including council and committee meetings are currently taking place electronically. Minutes from public meetings are posted on our website www.county.pictou.ns.ca 24 hours after the meeting takes place.

Council recently approved \$11 million to the first phase of its rural internet project that could see residents in the areas of Lyons Brook, Hardwood Hill, Abercrombie, and Granton have access to high-speed internet in 2020.

Landfill vouchers are now available for residential assessments in rural Pictou County

Vacant land, wood lots (forest acreage) and commercial assessments do not qualify. Each voucher will cover the cost of disposal at the Mount William Transfer Station up to 1,000 kilograms and must be used in accordance with the Municipality of Pictou County Solid Waste Resource Management Bylaw, the Pictou County Shared Services Mount William Transfer Station Policies and the Solid Waste Management Regulations of Nova Scotia.
